Marshall Gagné was raised in Greenwood, South Carolina. In the fall of 2006 he began studies at Lander University and in December 2011 earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Music Education. Shortly after graduation from Lander University he was invited to become the Principal Tubist for the Lander University Faculty Brass Quintet and the Emerald City Brass of Greenwood, SC. During the summers of 2012 & 2013 Marshall was a participant at the long established Sewanee Summer Music Festival at The University of the South. In the fall of 2012, Marshall began his graduate studies at Georgia State University, where he studied tuba performance with Eric Bubacz. While at GSU he was the co-director of the Tuba- Euphonium Ensemble, under the guidance of Eric Bubacz & Adam Frey. Since graduating from GSU in May of 2014, Marshall has developed a reputation as an in-demand performer, studio teacher, and clinician. Marshall has appeared with the Augusta Symphony Orchestra (GA) and the Sewanee Symphony, and was a founding member of the Metropolitan Atlanta Rogue Tuba Alliance tuba quartet. Since the completion of his Master of Music degree, Marshall has had the distinct privilege to study extensively with Warren Deck (New York Philharmonic (Ret.)), Christopher Olka (Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra), and Gene Pokorny (Chicago Symphony Orchestra).
