Saxophonist, clarinetist, flautist, and composer William Hollifield was born and raised in Atlanta, GA. While still early in his career, he has enjoyed a variety of experiences as a performer and composer. He began his performance career playing at Carnegie Hall and on NPR's From the Top at the age of just 16.
